Bowmen of Furness Senior Club Membership Form

- 1. All members of the club must hold a valid membership of Archery GB, also known as The Grand National Archery Society.
- 2. As an Archery GB affiliated club, the members must follow Archery GB rules and policies, these include "Policy for Safeguarding Children, Young People and Vulnerable Adults" and "Rules of Shooting".
- 3. Members will provide their own equipment within a reasonable period of time.
- 4. All archers are expected to assist in the laying out of the targets prior to shooting and stripping down the targets on completion of shooting.
- 5. All archers will shoot from a common shooting line.
- 6. On the indoor range no archer should shoot more than three arrows per end unless they can comfortably shoot more without holding up other archers who are only shooting three arrows. At quiet times archers may agree to shoot six arrows per end.
- 7. On the outdoor range no archer should shoot no more than six arrows per end, unless they can comfortably shoot more without holding up other archers who are only shooting six arrows.
- 8. Use of all-carbon arrows on the outdoor range is not permitted.
- One of the Committee members present will act as Field Captain or nominate an experienced club archer to act as Field Captain. In the absence of a Committee member, the most experienced club archer present, will be Field Captain.
- 10. The Field Captain must use a whistle to control shooting.
- 11. The outdoor range must be set out in accordance with the clubs venue inspection document. This document is available from the clubs secretary.
- 12. Arrows lost on the ground MUST be found to protect users of the ground from injury. Other archers should assist in looking for any lost arrows to minimise any disruption to shooting. A metal detector is available for this purpose. If an arrow is not found, the Field Captain must record it's loss and approximate position.
- 13. No arrows with broadheads or heavy field piles may be used on Club bosses.
- 14. No crossbows may be used at the Club.
